Artists Jozsef Paulini and Margreet Maes have their work featured in an exhibition at the High Street Restaurant, Penrith.

Jozsef Paulini migrated to Australia from Hungary in 1974 and is a student at the Penrith College of TAFE, in the art and design course, majoring in sculpture. He has held a one-man exhibition in Blacktown in 1985 and participated in various group exhibitions organised by ARTCO, of which Paul is a founding member.

Margreet Maes, born in the Netherlands in 1944, attended the Art College in Utrecht from 1959—1964, majoring in monumental art. She participated in several exhibitions in Spain and France.

After migrating to Australia in 1980, she studied art and design at Penrith College of TAFE, majoring in painting, between 1981 and 1985. She exhibited in 1986 with two other women from the Blue Mountains in the successful exhibition "A Splash of Colour."

As an ARTCO member, she has participated in a number of ARTCO group exhibitions.
